Dennis Holten mentioned that there is a different department that handles the signs. The mayor suggested that maybe there needs to be some better regulations on this matter and would like to hand this over to the parks and recreation committee. Danen asked how much a sign cost on the inside of the fence. The price is \$200.00. The mayor would like the parks and recs committee to get with Peyton and figure out better regulations or ordinance on this matter. Peyton stated that he spoke with Jim again about the issue and he reached back out to Travis for more clarification. Peyton also reached out to the sign owner to let them know of the situation.	
	The mayor stated that he got a call from a concerned citizen about Green Burials. This is a new type of burial where a body is buried without embalming them and not being put in a casket.
